# Island Bay Village upgrades

## Key points of focus

- Pedestrian prioritisation and improvement of amenities to encourage people to stop.
- Create an identity and character for the village through placemaking.
- Improve safety and accessibility of mid-block connections and adjacent laneways.
- Implement simple and durable design outcomes and functional spaces that encourage community activity.
- Improvements to the footpath to include better resurfacing and lighting.

## Lighting and safety

- Veranda and tree lighting in main shopping area to make it safer and more pleasant after dark.
- Improve the lighting in the laneway between The Parade and Clyde Street.

## Greening

- Planter beds and raised planters.

## Cinema and bus stop

- Enhance pedestrian priority here by adding planter boxes, seats and new footpath surfaces.

## Island Bay Library

- Create a stopping point with seats, play elements, signs, and furniture.

## Arts and heritage

- Embed stories and heritage into surfaces and signs.
- New murals by local artists on the public toilets and in the laneway between The Parade and Clyde Street.

## Public space and furniture

- Resurfacing the footpaths to make them safer and easier to use.
- New benches and bespoke site-specific seats to encourage people to stop, rest or spend time.
- Wayfinding and council services signage.
- Spill out space for businesses.

# Island Bay Village upgrades Island Bay Library

## Key points of focus

- Concrete walkway and "art space". The paved area is split by a smooth concrete path.
- Play space and creativity. A single low rock creates a natural element for children to jump and play.
- Native plants to help make the area more attractive.
- Proposed new sign closer to the street to better highlight the library.
- Timber edges to the new planter provide seating around the existing tree.

# Island Bay Village upgrades Public space and safety

## Key points of focus

- Yellow tactile pavers used at vehicle crossing points.
- Pedestrian crossing across the bike path. The bike path will have a lighter surface to make it clear where people should ride or expect to see bikes.
- Ground level native plantings. Trees will be pruned and uplift to increase visibility.
- Mural on the existing public toilet. (Mural shown is an example).
- More seats and gathering spaces provided in the main shopping area.
