

Community Update Meeting - Key Points

Wednesday, 9 August 2023 Island Bay Baptist Church 7-8:30 pm

Cycle Way Planning and Wakefield Park - clarification of planning and timeline

Sheila Hart, the Chair, welcomed residents and Councillors and opened the meeting.

WCC UPDATE (Presentation attached)

- WCC officers from the team working on the cycleway design are not attending this meeting because its representatives have received so much abuse at other community meetings.
 Sheila has met with WCC Officers and received an update to pass on.
- The cycle way plan is from Dee St to Berhampore and then on to Newtown, connecting with the Adelaide section.
- WCC working to achieve zero loss car parks but this may not be possible. However, there is currently no plan for '50% of parking' to be removed.
- There are going to be multiple opportunities to provide feedback into design development.
- The expected timeline for submissions is 12 September for 1 month (a week longer than normal).
- There is also a lot of media on WCC website.
- WCC encourages submissions and there is also an option to provide oral feedback.
- The final design will be voted on by councillors in mid-December.
- Concerns around pre-determination based on intention to commence work Mar/Feb. But work can be redirected if needed.
- The design must begin in advance of the formal consultation because a base design is needed for effective consultation.

DISCUSSION

- Save our Parks petition has 3000 signatories
- Chris Wratt spoke to this, representing the IB football club and their concerns about the significant loss of parking. This is not an anti-cycle way campaign.
- Wakefield is a regionally important sports club. How do we retain parks around the Wakefield zone? The sports club representatives have had good discussions with the cycleway team.
 Respect that their job is to make it happen and that it is difficult.
- It is not an easy fix. Adelaide Road is busy there is a wide median strip. The sports clubs' representatives are there to represent the views of members of those clubs and wider community use. E.g. Scouts, squash & tennis clubs
- The WCC team are working hard. There is potential to find off-road car parks. People are already parking on golf club and adjacent streets. No question that parking is over-subscribed.

Island Bay Residents' Association Inc

- Cycleway has a certain budget and doesn't include the provision of off-road parking. It is disappointing that parking requirements weren't planned for.
- Residents asked if there is going to be a resource for change management. Laurie Foon replied that there is a plan for a *regional* behaviour change programme.
- Residents asked for the IBRA Committee's view. The Chair replied that IBRA will not be
 making a submission because the issue is too controversial and our Constitution requires a
 neutral stance on cycle-way issues.
- A resident requested that IBRA take a poll from this meeting and communicate that to the Council.
- A resident suggested an alternative route for the cycleway. Councillors emphasised the need for expert advice to accompany alternative proposals and to assist WCC to make a decision.
- Roads are public spaces not just for cars and people who use roads have a right to be safe. Sympathy for the need for carparks.
- Clubs could encourage carpooling as part of change management.
- IBRA will share the Powerpoint via the website and newsletter.
- All members can enrol with WCC for updates on the cycleway.
- Several residents voiced concerns about parking and the cycleway.
- WCC Councillor said that the cycleway is not a done deal. How we do it is what we are discussing now. There will be arrangements for car-parking.

What do you want from your Residents' Association?

- Opportunity for you to say what you would like IBRA to do.
- Residents asked what is the point of the Residents Association if it won't submit or advocate on behalf of the community?
- The Chair asked how we would reach a consensus. Emphasised that we have a regular meeting once a month that anyone can attend.
- Two residents complained they were not receiving emails. IBRA will follow up personally to ensure these people are on the database.
- Survey 2022 clear from over 100 responses that the community doesn't want us to take a
 position and they feel more comfortable communicating their views to a neutral IBRA. Also,
 clear in the survey that the community split on the issue of the cycleway.
- A resident voiced support for IBRA agreeing that residents are individuals and can submit and support on issues that concern them and support the stance that IBRA not take a position.
- One resident communicated that this is a venue to communicate views and unless IBRA prepared to do so there is no point.
- The Chair said that the previous IBRA strong views alienated a significant part of the



community. It is valuable for people to come together who have different views.

- Another resident voiced concerns that IBRA did nothing for local businesses.
- The Chair replied that IBRA is only as strong as our committee membership invite people to be co-opted onto IBRA in last newsletter.
- IBRA provides forums that councillors attend and they can feed back to WCC on commentary.

MEVO comes to Island Bay

- It is the official launch of MEVO in the Bay today presenting an introduction to the service, the
 opportunity to have a peek at the vehicles and to receive a \$35 credit (for use before 1
 September)
- The Chair introduced Tian, the head of experience for MEVO. Tian commented that is great to see lots of public engagement at this forum.
- MEVO is a car share service the alternative to owning a car.
- There is an app that enables people to borrow a car when needed no ownership needed.
- MEVO an option when the weather is bad and cycling not an option!
- MEVO doing pretty well people have embraced the option an alternative to car ownership but useful for businesses too, they have a relationship with a number of businesses.
- You don't have to fill up electric vehicles an option App provides info on charging stations and parking spaces.
- Just need to download the App and verify details within 24 hours and then find a MEVO near you.
- What is the difference between Uber and MEVO? MEVO is good for multiple stops about having flexibility in transport options.
- MEVO is not trying to take cars away but just present an alternative. Cars are costly. Also they
 carry environmental and health impacts. Building parking buildings and spending time in
 traffic have environmental and social impacts.

Sheila said we are committed to a joint meeting and it is too late to change. There was a consensus that the meeting needs to be controlled so that candidates are safe to speak.
